Missouri Health Connection

Missouri Health Connection is a non-profit organization that operates Missouri's state-designated health information exchange Network. Established in 2009, MHC's mission is to enable health care providers from small rural clinics to large health systems-to securely share a patient's clinical data via a platform of robust interoperability across disparate electronic health record systems.

Tiger Institute Health Alliance

The Tiger Institute Health Alliance, a division of the Tiger Institute for Health Innovation is a coalition of health care organizations dedicated to improving the efficiency and quality of care delivery, while positively impacting the health of their communities and beyond. The Health Alliance consists of health care organizations throughout Missouri utilizing an array of advanced health information exchange solutions. Members began exchanging health information in early 2012 and represent hospitals, clinics, federally-qualified health centers, post-acute care providers, critical access hospitals and multiple health care providers.

Lewis and Clark Information Exchange

LACIE participants are from both Kansas and Missouri and range in size from small independent physician practices to large academic medical centers. Incorporated in 2009 LACIE has been exchanging data since 2010 between independent healthcare organizations and providers. Their mission is to improve the overall health and economic status of their region through facilitation of data sharing across the community; delivering common capability that citizens, providers and institutions are able to use.
